# FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY OF JESUS, MARY, AND JOSEPH

The Feast of the Holy Family is not just about the Holy Family, but about our own families too. The main purpose of the Feast is to present the Holy Family as the model for all Christian families, and for domestic life in general. Our family life becomes sanctified when we live the life of the Church within our homes. This is called the "domestic church" or the "church in miniature." St. John Chrysostom urged all Christians to make each home a "family church," and in doing so, we sanctify the family unit. Just how does one live out the Church in the family? The best way is by making Christ the center of family and individual life. Ways to do this include: reading scripture regularly, praying daily, attending Mass at least on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation, imitating the actions of the Holy Family, going to confession frequently, and so forth, all done together as a family unit.

The Holy Family feast is a good time to remember the family unit and pray for our human and spiritual families. We also may take this feast to reflect on the value and sanctity of the family unit, and to evaluate our own

family life. What ways may it be improved? What would Jesus, Mary, and Joseph do? Finally, we can use this feast to ask ourselves what are we doing to promote the family within our own cultures, neighborhoods, and communities.

#### WHAT IS FIRST FRIDAY?

The History of **First Friday** practices date to the last decades of the I7<sup>th</sup> century, when Jesus appeared to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, and spoke to her of His Sacred Heart. Among the 12 promises Our Lord Revealed to St. Margaret Mary, the I2<sup>th</sup> specifically referenced practices for Fridays: *The all powerful love of My Heart will grant to all those who shall receive Communion on the First Friday of Nine Consecutive Months the Grace of Final Repentance; they will not die under my displeasure, nor without receiving their Sacraments; My Heart will be their assured refuge in that last hour.* 

**Devotion to the Sacred Heart** as given to St. Margaret by Jesus, began to grow in popularity as soon as the saintly woman had died, but was officially recognized 75 years later. Though the devotion dictated to Margaret referred to 9 consecutive first Fridays, it does not need to end there. Many of the Catholic faithful continue to make the First Friday devotion beyond the nine consecutive months.

First Friday at Sacred Heart with Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will take place January 4 at 9 AM and ends with Closing and Benediction at 12:15.
