

FEAST OF THE CHAIR OF ST. PETER – February 22

This feast brings to mind the mission of teacher and pastor conferred by Christ on Peter, and continued in an unbroken line down to the present Pope. We celebrate the unity of the Church, founded upon the Apostle, and renew our assent to the Magisterium of the Roman Pontiff, extended both to truths which are solemnly defined *ex cathedra*, and to all the acts of the ordinary Magisterium.



The feast of the Chair of Saint Peter at Rome has been celebrated from the early days of the Christian era on 18 January, in commemoration of the day when Saint Peter held his first service in Rome. The feast of the Chair of Saint Peter at Antioch, commemorating his foundation of the See of Antioch, has also been long celebrated at Rome, on 22 February. At each place a chair (cathedra) was venerated which the Apostle had used while presiding at Mass. One of the chairs is referred to about 600 by an Abbot Johannes who had been commissioned by Pope Gregory the Great to collect in oil from the lamps which burned at the graves of the Roman martyrs. – *New Catholic Dictionary*

Sacred Heart Youth Group along with Sacred Heart School are hosting a shoe drive to help those who do not have safe drinking water through an organization called WaterStep. This is an organization that assesses water problems in communities that do not have safe drinking water. Then volunteers implement ways to obtain safe water and educate the local people on ways to more easily get the clean water to drink. This program enables communities to take care of their own needs when it comes to safe drinking water. In order to obtain the tools needed, the WaterStep Organization collects new and used shoes to fund the making of tools used to collect water and/or funds to create water wells in communities. There are boxes placed in the church and in the school outside of the office. If you have any unneeded shoes, please bring them into our collection boxes. WHAT DOES EDCHOICE MEAN FOR SACRED HEART SCHOOL?

The EdChoice Scholarship Program provides up to 60,000 state-funded scholarships to students who attend low-performing public school buildings. The scholarship must be used to attend private schools that meet requirements for program participation. Coshocton City Schools and Ridgewood Elementary Schools have both been designated as low-performing by the Ohio State Department of Education.
