Living the Joy of the Gospel

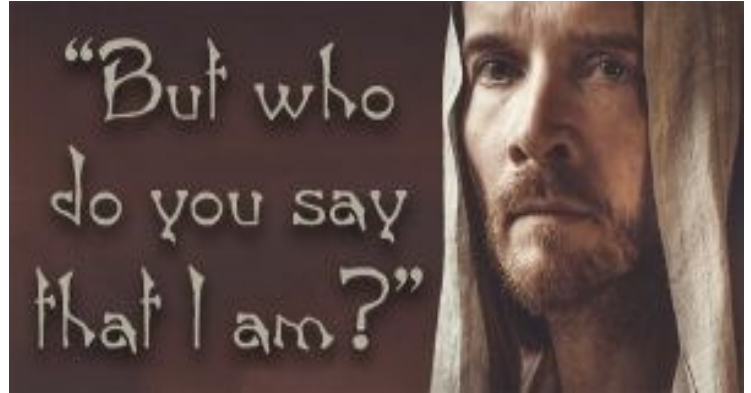
Dear Parishioners:

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

*How do I answer the question Jesus asks his disciples:
 "Who do you say that I am?"*

Jesus' disciples initially tell him that people say he is John the Baptist or Elijah or Jeremiah or one of the prophets, like Isaiah. A prophet is not one who can predict the future; a prophet is one chosen by God, sent by God, who speaks on Behalf, and commits to spreading God's message. In this sense Jesus is a prophet, but not just "one of the prophets" (Matthew 16:14). He is not just chosen by God, he is the Son of the living God. He is not just delivering a message, he is the Word of God. He is not just pointing to salvation, he is our salvation. Peter realized this uniqueness of Jesus, and so Jesus gives him the authority over all believers.
