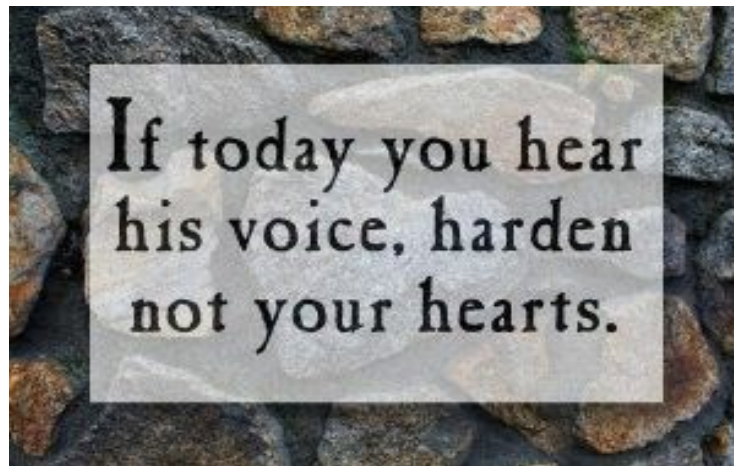


**BISHOP'S ANNUAL APPEAL 2020**
