**INTRODUCTION TO THE LITURGY OF THE DAY...**

"Lord, have mercy," we pray at the beginning of Mass, calling upon the Lord to have mercy on us in our sinfulness. Today we celebrate that divine mercy, the mercy that is stronger than any fault, any wrong, any sin, the mercy that always seeks to reconcile us with the Lord, the mercy that led God to send the Son to win our salvation. Let us rejoice that we are always able to receive that tender mercy.

**QUESTION OF THE WEEK**

*To whom do I need to offer mercy?*

We bestow mercy on someone when they have done something wrong, choosing to refrain from punishing them even when they deserve some penalty. But more than that, the mercy that Jesus taught in the story of the prodigal son, showed to the woman caught in adultery, and offered Peter after he denied him three times is a mercy that is steeped in empathy, a mercy given to someone who is not able to forgive him or herself. It is when we have been wronged by someone who feels that they are beyond mercy that we are called to imitate our Lord in offering mercy. Not because he or she deserves it. Because without mercy, we are all lost.
