In today's Gospel, we hear Jesus calm the raging sea as his disciples' cling to the storm-tossed boat. The disciples were terrified that they would die, but Jesus suggests that their faith should have reassured them. Many of us can probably recall a time when our father came to our rescue, protecting or supporting us, making everything all right. Today, we honor our dads, our grandfathers, Godfathers, uncles, and all who have acted as fathers in our lives. May their protection and constancy be a model of God's care for us.

**JESUS' REAL PRESENCE**

As the great storm raged, the disciples woke Jesus saying, "Do you not care that we are perishing?" When the storm was approaching, why did the disciples wait so long to appeal to the Lord? Maybe the lack of faith Jesus accuses them of is thinking he would not want to be bothered with their problem. Jesus gives us his real presence in the Eucharist not just for serious emergencies but because he wants to be present in our lives at every moment. He wants to strengthen our faith, to share our joys, and to counsel and console us in every struggle.

**Question of the Week**

*Would Jesus ask me, "Do you yet have faith?"*

*Does my faith strengthen and console me during times of trial?*

Mark emphasizes that Jesus patiently allowed the disciples to gradually come to know him. Twice Jesus used the word *phimoo* (**Be Silent!**) to prevent his identity to be suddenly revealed. The first time was to rebuke an unclean spirit whom Jesus confronted at the beginning of his ministry. The second time, as we heard today, was spoken to the wind and the sea. He muzzled the forces of chaos—spiritual and physical—that could have immediately identified him. The disciples' faith still needed to blossom. So, sometimes, does ours.
