INTRODUCTION TO THE LITURGY OF THE DAY...
 We have responded to the call of the Lord by gathering together in this holy place to worship God, to listen to the Word, and to share in the Eucharist. When we leave, we are asked to go forth as changed persons, nourished by the Lord so that we can witness to our faith outside these four walls. In today's Gospel, Jesus sent the disciples out to carry on his mission, empowering them with his authority. In baptism, we have been empowered by Christ to carry on his mission as well. May today's celebration inspire us to renew our commitment to the Christian mission.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK
When has my compassion for someone or for others pushed aside my own needs? How can I put others' needs first more often?
 Mark does not tell us the "many things" that Jesus taught the vast crowd (6:34), but we do know the lessons he taught the Twelve. He taught them what their priorities should be. Tired and hungry, they hoped to get some rest away from the townsfolk, some of them they may have just visited when Jesus sent them out two by two. But their plans were changed in an instant, for Jesus' heart was moved to pity. Compassion caused them to turn their attention away from themselves and their need for food and rest so they could attend to strangers in need of healing and guidance. Lesson learned.
