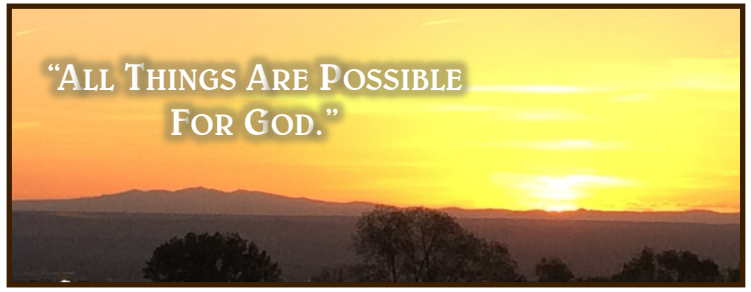


**COLLAR CORNER**
