How can I walk in the Lord's paths in my own community and with my own family?

Advent begins as early as it possibly can this year, but it still doesn't arrive before the deluge of Christmas music, decorations, and advertisements. Today's Gospel provides us with a bracing counterpoint to this premature merriment. There'll be no parties in anticipation of the apocalypse! Paul and Isaiah show us a different way to prepare. Let us "put on the armor of light" and "walk in (the Lord's oaths". Paul's metaphor of armor implies that hardships await, but light tells us that what we do should be done openly, enlightening others by our example. Paul says we should "put on the Lord Jesus Christ", as he did, even in his own continual hardships. This is how we truly walk in the Lord's paths.
